NEW ADDITIONS ARRIVE AT CCHS

Due to a shortage of available dogs in our area for the past couple of months, the CCHS took the opportunity to help Lisa Welborn, a rescuer at "Dogs into Pets."

Welborn, who has been using her own money to rescue dogs for several years, acquired a large number of animals that would have been put down inhumanely by the breeder who no longer wanted them.

CCHS took in four Schnauzers, two Rat Terriers and a Dachshund.

These animals had been kept in small cages and had received little attention or care.

These animals had so little contact with people that they are fearful of humans.

Seldom, if ever, let out of their cages, they are not used to walking on a leash or even on the grass and were hesitant to even move at first.

It will take a lot of time and patience to help them adjust to people and their new world.

The rescued dogs are currently living with foster families until loving, permanent homes can be found for them.
